



Complete the diagram below, by using basic shapes to represent the four large boxes, the two chairs, the antenna and the suitcase.









- lago sits on a large box downstage left, facing Othello, holding a cigarette. (Graphic and shorthand.)
- 2. lago turns downstage and puts the cigarette in his mouth. (Shorthand.)
- 3. lago stands and moves to the suitcase downstage right, picks up the suitcase and puts it on the box downstage right. (*Graphic and shorthand.*)
- 4. lago turns to Othello, then moves to the antenna downstage centre. (Graphic and shorthand.)
- 5. lago picks up the antenna and moves to the suitcase. (Graphic and shorthand.)
