

Before playing the first video, this short exercise will provide some context for the Scots language used in the song.

Explain

Today we are going to be learning a song in the Scots language

Ask

What does 'Scots' mean?

Explain

- Scots is a language spoken in modern Scotland
- It is one of the three native languages of Scotland English, Scots and Gaelic
- It is spoken by one and a half million people
- It is almost a thousand years old!
- It comes originally from Denmark and from the language of a Danish tribe called the Angles


3b. Scots Words

5a. Video One: Key Words

Now play the first video (you can print off the lyrics if you feel this will help your class)

After the first video – check for understanding:

- What does 'oral tradition' mean?

Discussion points

- Do you use Scots words?
- Do you know someone in your family or community who uses Scots words?
- How do you feel when you use Scots words?
- Who do you hear using the most Scots words?

5b. Video Two: The Verses

Now play the second video.

After the second video - check for understanding:

- What is the song about?

Discussion points

- Were there any Scots words you didn't recognise in the verses?
- What do you think they mean?
- Do you know any other Scots songs?

5c. Video Three: Body Percussion

Now play the third and last video.

- After the third video check for understanding:
- What are dynamics?

Discussion points

- Do you know any percussion instruments?
- What instruments could be used to accompany this song?
- What do you think the message of the song is?
